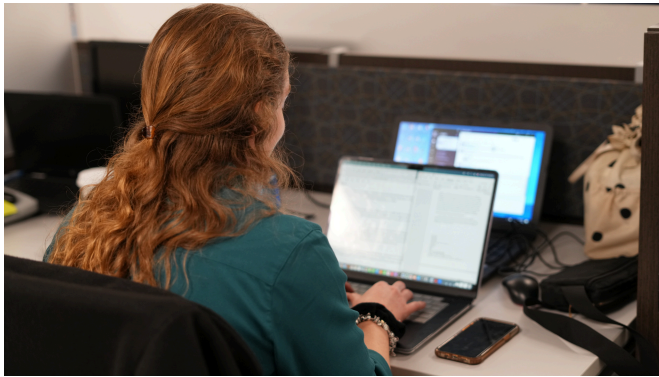

- Based at the LULAC National Office in Washington, D.C.
- Please note that since these are unpaid, students will be required to secure either academic credit from their institution and/or an outside stipend

Policy and Legislation Fellowship Program

The Fellowship Program empowers emerging leaders to address key issues impacting the Latino community - such as healthcare, immigration, civil rights, education, environmental concerns, labor, technology & AI or the economy. Fellows will be able to conduct independent research, explore career options, and learn from industry experts.

Fellows will contribute to major events such as the National Legislative Conference and the LULAC National Convention and will support various tasks related to LULAC's policy agenda



Core Roles and Responsibilities

- Conduct in-depth policy research on healthcare access, civic engagement, and technology, addressing intersections with immigration, socioeconomic barriers and language challenges
- Write and prepare research manuscripts for peer-reviewed publication
- Assist in organizing and presenting research findings at seminars, webinars, and virtual meetings with LULAC council members and stakeholders
- Lead 'Teach-in' seminars and attend policy events and hearings in Capitol Hill
